Message from Health Office

Message from the Counselor

8th Grade families: it is almost time for your child to select their classes for high school. I will be providing information at the parent coffee on January 15th, 2026. Information will be shared from the high school as well as suggestions from my own experience as a counselor. On January 21st, counselors from the high school will come to present to 8th grade students in the morning regarding course selection, and the following week on January 28th, students will have the opportunity to meet with a high school counselor to submit their course selections.

Upward Bound Program: There are two Upward Bound programs available to 8th grade students which will start the summer after their 8th grade year:

<u>Waubonsee</u>: Waubonsee's Upward Bound program provides support for college readiness and has an office at EAHS. More information will be provided as soon as I receive it.

Northern Illinois University: NIU's Upward Bound program is a college preparatory program that provides academic counseling, skill development, general preparation and placement for students who plan to continue their education after high school. Students are not required to attend NIU after high school to be part of the Upward Bound Program. Applications are currently available in my office- encourage your student to stop by and grab one from me. We will also have a representative from NIU Upward Bound come to speak with interested students- details coming soon! Illinois Math and Science Academy (IMSA) Presentation: Representatives from IMSA will be providing a presentation to eligible students and parents on Thursday, December 11th from 5:00pm-6:00pm in the LRC. The presentation will be provided in both English and Spanish. There are two IMSA programs that will be discussed- IMSA Promise and IMSA Admissions.

IMSA Promise eligibility:

- Current 7th or 8th grade student
- A's and B's in all classes since 6th grade (No grades below a "B")
- Scores greater than the 50th percentile on NWEA MAP assessments
- Interest in STEM

IMSA Admissions eligibility (high school):

- Current 8th grade student
- Mostly A's in all classes since 6th grade (All A's preferred)
- Must take the ACT or SAT
- Must be enrolled in or have completed the equivalent of Algebra 1 and a high school equivalent science course (science course must be taken online as we do not provide a high school level science course at FRMA). Most students opt to take Biology.
